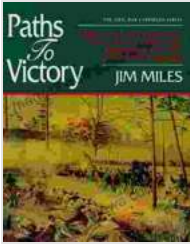

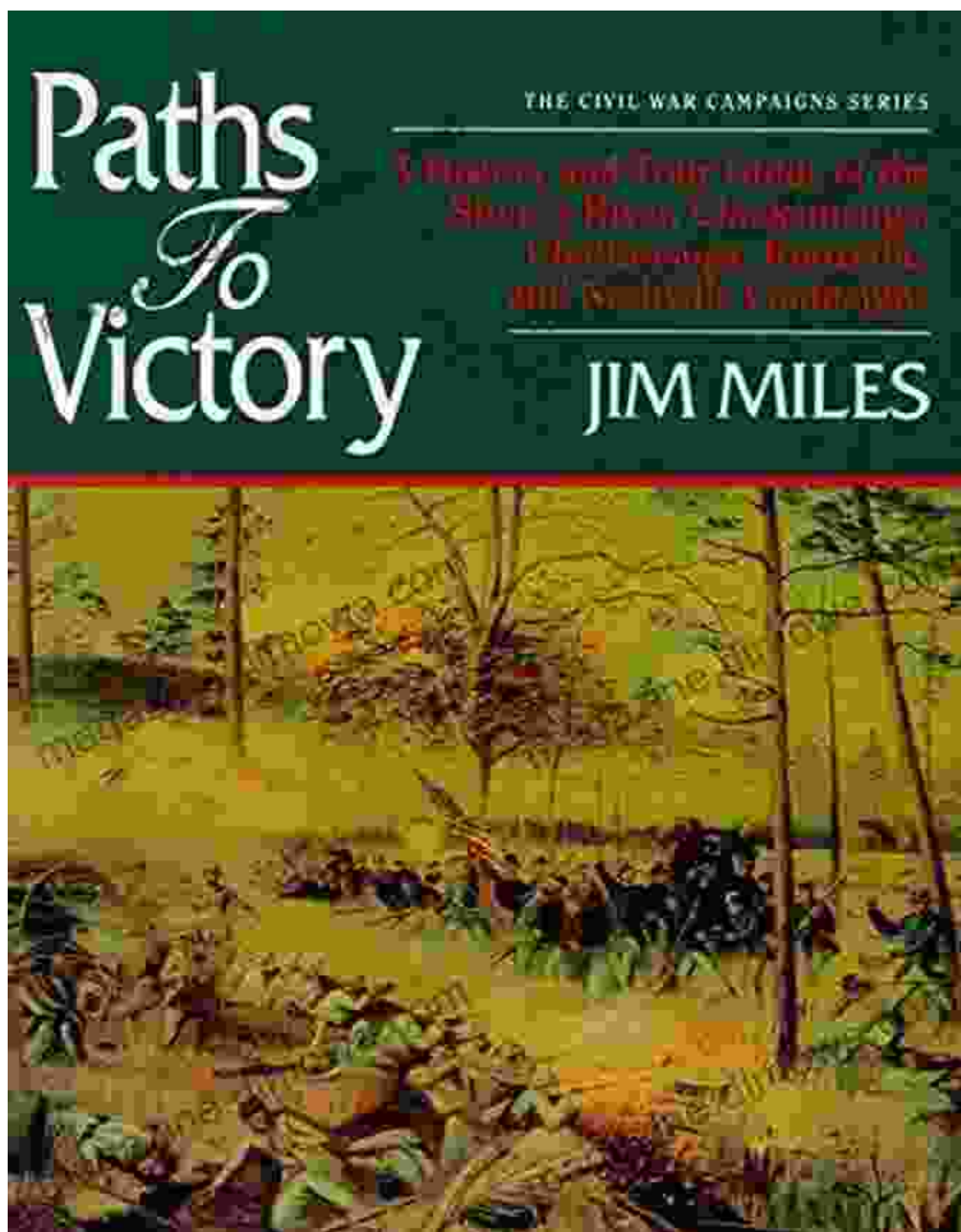

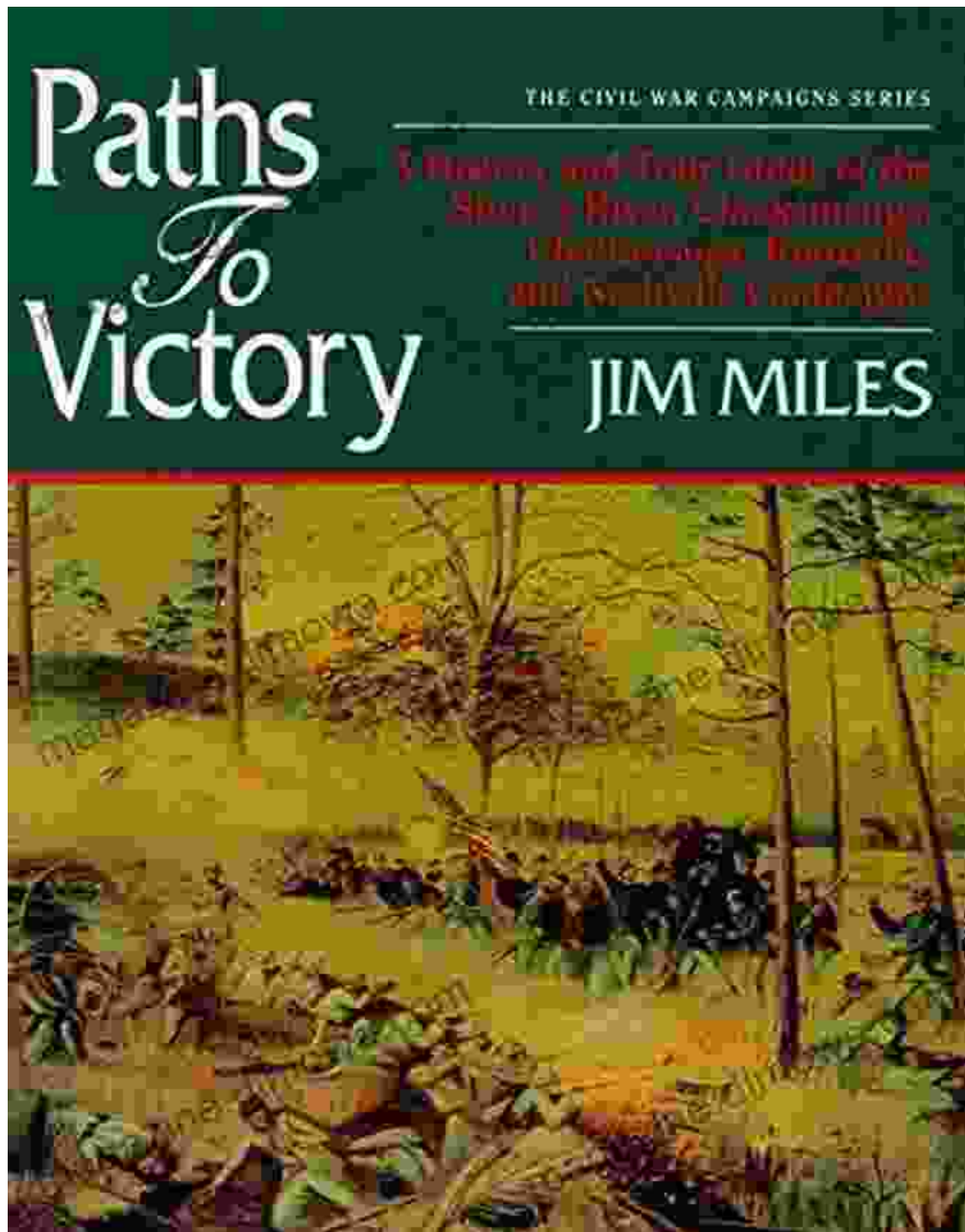

Chickamauga battlefield

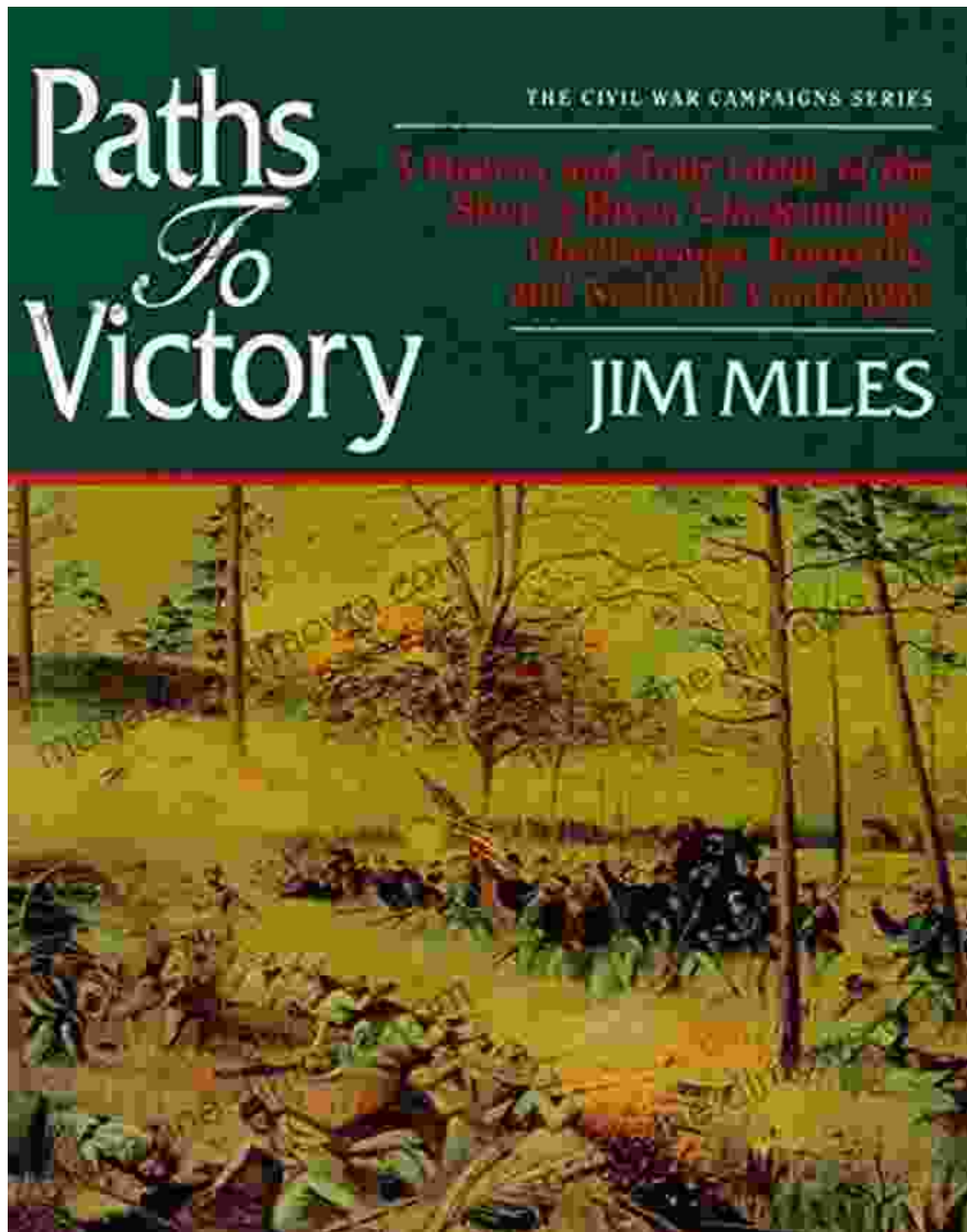

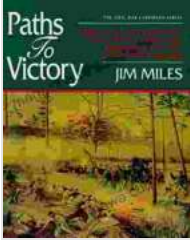
Chapter 4: Knoxville

Knoxville battlefield

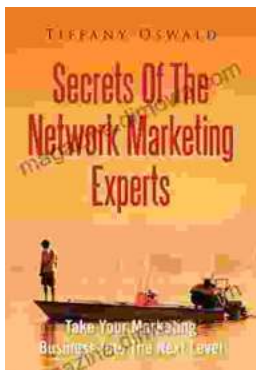
